



Updated Trade Compliance Program Requirements



The Customs Trade Partnership Against Terrorism (CTPAT) Trade Compliance Program is a core trade compliance program for many importers as it allows them to assume responsibility for import management, while fostering a relationship with U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). However, the new anti-forced labor requirements require trade professionals to perform substantial supply chain due diligence. Essentially, these requirements reshape the face of the CTPAT Trade Compliance Program.

These new anti-forced labor program requirements that are now part of the CTPAT Trade Compliance program (formerly ISA) necessitate that importers gain supply chain visibility, enhance internal anti-forced labor programs and share learnings – in addition to existing CTPAT requirements. For many importers, these additional steps will strain resources. But KPMG can help manage new and existing requirements – so importers can help focus on strategic priorities.
